Jury Service Experience

Serving on a jury is not a common experience, however, we appreciate you serving our community.

You will be asked to listen to testimony and to review and examine evidence and facts. .

We understand that making a decision is not an easy process, however we do appreciate your cooperation and participation in the process.

Throughout the process, you may experience juror stress.

Juror stress refers to the physical and emotional reaction to jury service.

Juror Stress can be caused by a multitude of reasons at any stage throughout your jury service.

Coping Tech-→ niques for Juror Stress

After serving on a jury, you may experience emotional and physical symptoms of distress. This includes but is not limited to the following: anxiety, sleep or appetite change, fluctuation in mood, headaches, stomach aches, little to no energy, etc.

There are a multitude of ways to help cope when dealing with stress after serving on a jury. This includes, but not limited to the following: talk to someone, follow your daily routine thereafter, don't isolate yourself, cut down on alcohol, caffeine, and nicotine, relax with meditation/deep breathing, do "boring" activities before bedtime, listen to relaxation noises or relaxing music, etc. Do whatever decompression technique is best for you.

If signs of distress continue for two weeks or more after your jury service has ended, please consider contacting your physician.

Final Thoughts

Remember that Jury Service is a right that citizens have to engage in the judicial process.

Sometimes, it takes a lot of courage to serve as a juror. Sometimes the cases are violent in nature and can be hard to deal with throughout the process and thereafter. Just remember that the case is now over with and you did the best you could.
